AGM

On 5 February we held our AGM, and thanks are due to those who braved a very cold night. We welcome Antonia O'Mullane as our new Vice Chair; other officers were re-elected.

Our Chair, Helene O'Mullane, gave an interesting report of the year's activities through late 2016 and 2017. These included the talk by **Dr Marian Shaw** on her book about her great-great grandfather, Zachariah Pearson, after which she kindly accepted our invitation to become an official patron of FPP.

HERITAGE LOTTERY: 2ND GRANT!

As well as the main Heritage Lottery Funding grant of some £3.2 million, FPP has also secured a £3,000 separate grant for learning projects on the park and its history (see further below). It is hoped we can organise a Pearson Park "family day" in the spring to present certificates to participants in the Heritage Learning days. These projects, it is hoped, will encourage future generations to take responsibility for caring for "their" park, in contrast to the unfortunate vandalism of last summer.

The Pearson Park Trust have invited us to the unveiling of a BLUE PLAQUE commemorating Zachariah Pearson

It will be installed at 64 Pearson Park (the last address before he died).

Afterwards, Dr Marian Shaw, our Patron, will give a short talk in the Conservatory.

Obviously, internal work might then have to be carried out but we hope that the Conservatory, now in quite a forlorn state, will be up and running before too long. Watch that space!
